SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT OCTOBER 2014

Nashville C.C.S.D. #49 would like to congratulate the faculty and staff members of our pre-kindergarten program. The Nashville pre-kindergarten program was recently awarded the highest ranking possible on the state's new ExceleRate rating and improvement system. The program achieved the Gold quality ranking for excellence in the areas of personnel qualifications, programming, curriculum content, and overall effectiveness of the program. The faculty and staff members who work in the pre-kindergarten program are Nancy Schmale, Lori Schnitker, Karen Bunker, and Denise Czajkowski.

As a reminder to our middle school families, we have made a change to the way our October 16th and 17th parent/teacher conferences are scheduled. We are no longer requiring all parents to attend a conference. Instead, the teachers will be scheduling conferences on an as-needed basis. If you did not receive a conference invitation form but would like to speak with a specific teacher, please contact the teacher by either phone or email to schedule a date and time.

I would also like to remind our middle school parents that the computer lab is open and available for students early in the morning. The students are welcome to come in early to use the school's wireless system, work on homework, or get assistance with homework from Ms. Sabo. We are going to adjust the times beginning on Tuesday, October 14 to accommodate students who want to stay after school as well. The new times for the lab will be from 7:30 AM-3:45 PM. I am also working with Pearson at this time to try to schedule some parent nights. It would be our hope that these nights will give parents the opportunity to learn more about the Pearson platforms and the materials that are being used in the school. We will let everyone know when these nights get scheduled.

I also want to update everyone on the status of the possibility of our school district merging with Hoyleton CSD #29. As you know, both districts had contracted with a school district reorganization specialist at the end of the last school year. The specialist recently completed a feasibility study to determine if the reorganization would work for both districts. As soon as we receive a finalized copy, we will post it on our web site. Hoyleton #29 held a community meeting on October 7 to discuss the specifics of this issue with their families, but no final decisions have been made by that district. There has also been no timetable established for them to make their final decision. I will do my best to keep everyone informed of the progress of this issue.

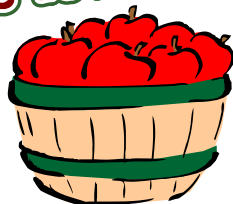

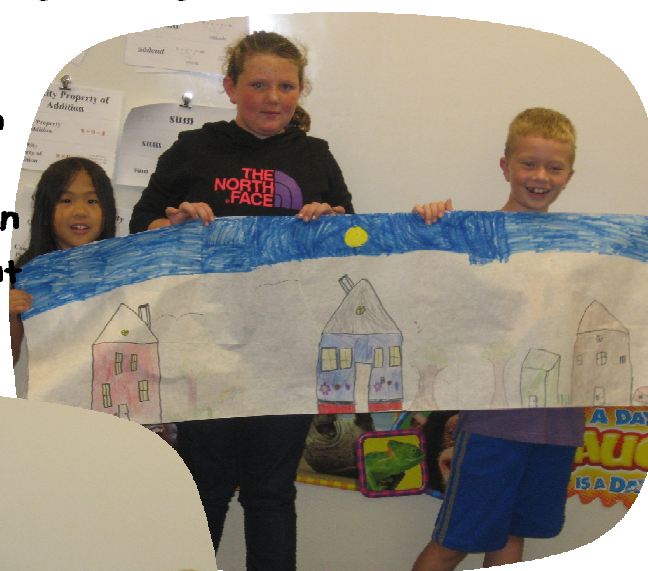
MRS. MITCHELL'S 3RD GRADE

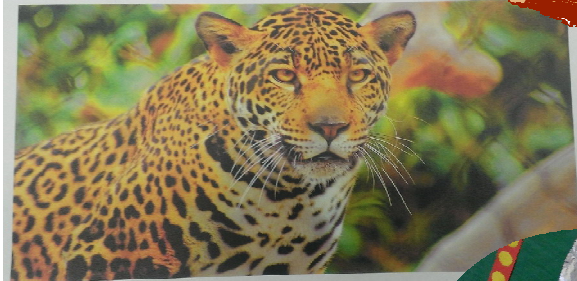

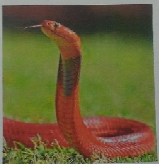

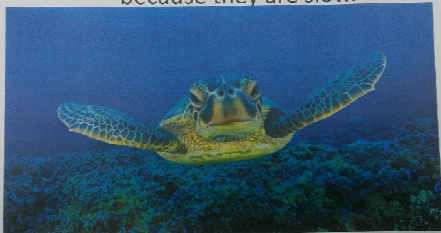

Nashville Primary's Running Program



The 2nd, 3rd & 4th grade students participate in a running program that occurs every Friday during Physical Education class. The program encourages students to set goals, while finding a love for fitness!

How does the program work?

- While participating in the running program, the students run to earn straws. For every lap they run, they receive a straw from the teacher.
- At the end of class the students count the number of straws they have earned and report their accomplishment to the teacher.
- Their laps completed are recorded, and their progress is tracked throughout the school year.

Rewards and Incentives

- * Toe Tokens - If the student achieves 10 laps during a class period, they will receive a toe token. The tokens can be displayed on their shoelaces or a necklace.
- * Mileage Tokens - For every 5 miles a student achieves, he or she will receive a mileage token.
- * Mileage Club Certificates are given to the students for every 5 miles he or she runs.
- * The top 10 runners, runners of the week, and the most improved runners will be displayed on the gym's bulletin board.
